
THE BLESSING

Amen.


We sit quietly while the organ plays, and the choir and ministers leave the church.

Welcome to St Martin's Church!

We are a small and friendly Church of England church, where everyone is welcome - whether you go to church often, or whether this is your first time!

BIBLE READING

At the end of the reading, we use this response:

Now we sing a quiet **hymn**, followed by some silence, so we can think and pray about the words we have heard.

GOSPEL READING

We stand for the Gospel reading and sing:
Alleluia! Alleluia!
(x2)

...and say:

Speak Lord, for your people are listening.

...and sing:

Alleluia! Alleluia! (x2)

At the beginning of the reading, we say:

Reader Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

... and at the end:

Reader This is the Gospel of the Lord All:

Praise to you, O Christ

THE ADDRESS

The preacher will speak, or lead us in an activity to help us learn more about Jesus. and what it means to be a Christian.

THE CREED

We stand to declare the Christian faith that we share:

Priest Let us declare our faith in God:

All We believe in God, the Father of every person in heaven and on earth.

> We believe in God. the Son who lives in our hearts And fills us with his love.

> We believe in God. the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with God's power every day.

We believe in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.



PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

We pray for our world, and everyone in it who needs God's help and quidance.

Sometimes we use the response:

Leader Lord, in your mercy

All: Hear our prayer

THE PEACE

We share a sign of peace with one another.

Priest The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All And also with you

We sing a hymn while a collection is taken for the work of the church in this community.

The money, and bread and wine, are brought to the altar table as offerings to God - and to use in our Holy Communion.

The priest may invite someone from the congregation (C) to help to lead the prayers.
