The Diocese of Leeds is offering five grants of up to £250 in matched-funding for volunteer or paid worker expenses relating to attending the National Youth Ministry Weekend, to complement five free tickets to the conference that have been provided by the Growing Faith Foundation, Vision & Strategy and Ministry Development teams.

Introduction

We want you to have a great time at the National Youth Ministry Weekend, and this offer is designed to help make that happen. We want to support your church in having your back – investing in you is important, partly because we hope it then benefits young people connected to your church (or helps those no connected become connected), but significantly because we want to support your calling to ministry with young people.

The National Youth Ministry Weekend is taking place from Friday 22nd to Sunday 24th November 2024 at Resorts World Birmingham, a centre that hosts a conference suite, a cinema, shops and restaurants. It's next to the National Exhibition Centre (NEC) and Birmingham International Airport and Birmingham International Railway Station.

Travel

Coming by train? Birmingham International Railway Station is a short walk through the NEC from Resorts World. Coming by car? Free parking is available for conference delegates nearby.

Accommodation

You are free to stay with friends or family in Birmingham if that would suit you. The Diocese of Birmingham have set up a scheme where they are connecting delegates with Christians from across the city who are happy to host you – more information at https://www.youthscape.co.uk/nymw/offers.

There are also several hotels in the vicinity of the NEC, as well as elsewhere in Birmingham that you can reach by rail or road.

Food

There are a range of restaurants at Resorts World, as well as a couple of coffee shops and a small convenience store. Be aware that restaurants will get busy during the conference breaks! Find more information about eateries at

Programme

This conference is to support and equip you in your ministry. It's up to you what in the programme you go to, and how much you go to or not go to – we trust you to identify your needs and won't be checking up on this. Please respect the gift that's made this possible, but also be reassured that it's been made with you and your needs in mind.

Reception

Resources

Each year at the National Youth Ministry Weekend, attendees are given free resources. These are yours to keep (or give to your church if you prefer)! Other resources will be on sale, so you might want to know if you have your church's permission to buy any of these before you go (we won't be reimbursing you for these though; sorry!).

Expenses Terms and Conditions

There are some terms and conditions on the pages beyond. They give some detail of what the Diocese of Leeds will reimburse (or what it won't). Do read the detail but, in essence, the line is: please do use it, please don't abuse it.

We welcome applications from anyone involved in ministry with young people through a Diocese of Leeds church, whether in a paid or voluntary capacity. Your application will require the support of your parish priest or PCC; we will need their signature on the form overleaf.

The Diocese of Leeds has been allocated five tickets to the National Youth Ministry Weekend, and has set aside funding to support five people in attending the event. Should we receive more than five applications, we will weigh up which ones are to receive funding in the following order:

- 1. If applications are received from five or more churches, we will only fund one person per church.
- 2. If applications are received from all five episcopal areas, we will only fund one person per episcopal area.
- 3. If applications are received from five or more people who have not previously attended NYMW, we will only fund people that have not previously attended NYMW.
- 4. Selection will be based on 100-word statements from applicants.

Expenses Terms and Conditions

The Diocese of Leeds ('the Diocese') will match-fund (at a 1:1 ratio) expenses claims for travel, accommodation and food relating to the National Youth Ministry Weekend submitted to the church PCC. To claim, submit a Diocesan expenses form to graeme.bigg@leeds.anglican.org with copies of associated receipts by 22nd January 2025.

Travel

The Diocese will pay towards travel costs by car (reimbursed at a rate of 45p/mi), motorbike (24p/mi) or bicycle (20p/mi) or public transport (standard class). We would expect the journeys to be undertaken between the 22nd and 24th of November, although are open to conversation about travel to and from Birmingham on different days. Aside from the journey from home to Birmingham and back, the other journeys covered would be between the accommodation and Resorts World Birmingham.

Accommodation

The Diocese will pay towards a standard room in accommodation located within a reasonable travel distance of Resorts World Birmingham. Meals booked via the accommodation provider are eligible for expenses (see 'Food', below), but no other associated costs (e.g. laundry) will be met. We cannot make a direct gift to friends or family for a stay, but are open to a conversation about how we can support them – please contact us beforehand if this is a possibility.

Food

The Diocese will pay towards the cost of meals (up to six across the weekend) and snacks (up to six across the weekend) for one person from Friday evening to Sunday afternoon. The cost of any alcoholic drinks will not be met.

PCC Expenses Policy

The Diocese will not pay towards anything not covered by a PCC's expenses policy, except in exceptional circumstances. Please contact us beforehand if this is a concern.

Payment

Payment will be in the form of a refund of expenses, made upon submission of receipts, to the church PCC. The Diocese reserves the right to check whether expenses claims have been paid by the PCC before issuing this refund.

Reasonable Expenses

The Diocese of Leeds reserves the right to reject unreasonable expenses claims.

Conduct

Should the conference attendee's conduct at any point over the weekend bring the Diocese of Leeds into disrepute, the Diocese reserves the right to reject their expenses claim.
